

Periodic Checks

You should also perform other periodic maintenance checks at least once a month regardless of how often you ride, or more often if you ride frequently.

Also, check the odometer reading against the Maintenance Schedule and perform all maintenance that is due. ➔P.39

Tires and wheels	Check the air pressure (➔P. 51), examine tread for wear and damage (➔P. 56), and check the wheels for damage.
Fluid levels	Check the engine oil level (➔P. 60), engine coolant level (➔P. 65), and brake fluid level (➔P. 67).
Lights	Check that the headlight, position light, brake light, taillight, turn signals and license plate light are working properly.
Controls	Check the freeplay of the clutch lever (➔P. 74) and throttle grip (➔P. 77).
Drive chain	Check the slack (➔P. 70), adjust the slack (➔P. 71), and lubricate (➔P. 50) as needed.
Fuses	Check that you have a full supply of spare fuses.
Nuts & bolts	Check the major nuts and bolts, and tighten as needed.
