Drive chain	Check the slack (\triangleright P. 73), adjust the slack (\triangleright P. 74), and lubricate (\triangleright P. 45) as needed.	
Fuses	Check that you have a full supply of spare fuses.	
Nuts & bolts	Check the major nuts and bolts, and tighten as needed.
