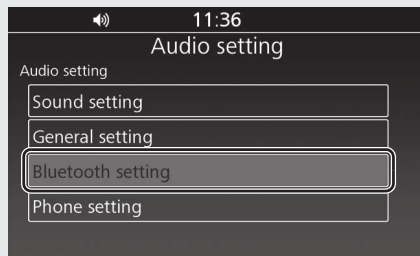


## Bluetooth Setting

You can connect with your iPhone or other mobile phone and/or *Bluetooth*® headsets via *Bluetooth*®.

Your motorcycle can establish up to 3 *Bluetooth*® connections at the same time. Available devices are as follows:

- [Phone pairing] (For iPhone or mobile phone) ➔ P.82
- [Rider HS pairing] (For rider headset) ➔ P.86
- [Passenger HS pairing] (For passenger headset) ➔ P.86

- You cannot pair an iPhone/*Bluetooth*® device while the motorcycle is moving. When pairing, park your motorcycle in a safe place.
- *Bluetooth*® connection cannot be established while launching Apple CarPlay.
- Your motorcycle is not equipped with intercom function. If you want to use intercom function, use the intercom function of your headset.
- Some local governments prohibit the use of a headset by the operator of a motor vehicle. Always obey applicable laws and regulations.
